My Dear Friends,

Empathy is the foundation and the heart of the design thinking process. Everything else is built upon it. Empathy is a powerful tool to develop an understanding of others' needs, requiring one to look beyond oneself and see the world from someone else's point of view. Every day, we, as EICASA try to create experiences at the Institute. Yet, how often do we stop to think how the users (the students, parents, teachers, members and anyone else who comes in contact with the branch) are receiving those experiences.

Honestly seeking to understand their situation can change our perception in such a way that they are better prepared to meet the needs.

When problems arise at the Institute, it's easy for many of us to give our two cents about how it should be handled. After all, we are educated, intelligent people with frequent opinions about how things should be done. How often, though, do we ask the opinion of those who are actually having the problem? So, when a new policy isn't working or an event isn't going as smoothly as we had planned, we are missing an opportunity to create a better solution if we don't seek input from all involved. In design thinking, establishing a clear definition of the challenge at hand requires seeking the input of those who are being directly affected. That means listening to the people involved so as to understand their point of view as well as including them in the process for designing the solution, or at least providing feedback on it. Clearly defining the problem gives one a better chance at creating a clear solution.

Once we understand the user's needs, we will be better equipped to meet them. During the brainstorming process, we will work in teams to rapidly generate as many solutions as we can to the problems we are addressing. We will frequently ask ourselves to take a "blue sky thinking" approach and suggest ideas in which the sky's the limit and money is no object.

Frequently, these ideas that lie outside of the box of one's normal thinking yield innovative solutions. On identifying the most actionable solutions, we will hone them into prototypes that can be tested.

Whenever the branch institutes a new idea or policy, we consider it a prototype that's subject to revision instead of an edict that's written in stone. Understanding that prototypes may go through multiple iterations before a final product is produced encourages a mindset that's flexible, agile, and willing to work through the problem until the best result is obtained. So, if input from members and students reveal a problem, instead of doubling down, we will modify and revise based on their feedback until we develop the strongest solution. Involving the stakeholders can create not only stronger buy-in, but often stronger ideas as well.

The final stage in the design thinking process involves testing the prototype to determine what works and what could be improved upon. As previously mentioned, we strive to be flexible when rolling out any new initiative. Too often, if a new idea doesn't work flawlessly right out of the gate, it's quickly labelled a failure. When this happens (and it will), we shouldn't think of it as simply failing, but think of it as failing forward -- an outlook which recognizes that if one doesn't give up, if one learns from the mistakes made, he/she is better positioned to create a stronger solution next time.

Make one's course corrections based on observation and feedback, then roll out Version Two.

This shall be the vision of EICASA 2022-23. We aim to take the Siliguri Branch to its peak, by not only involving every member and student but also with empathy.



PREDATORY PRICING

What is Pricing Decision?

By the term pricing decision, we mean the choices of business entities taken into consideration by them while setting the prices for their products and services. As price of a product plays an important role in growth of the business entities.

Price of a product must be set after considering various factors like;

- 1. Pricing for different market structures.
- 2. Competitors
- 3. Type of Product and services
- 4. Demand and Supply of such products and services.
- 5. Cost structure

Importance of Pricing Decision

For the Long Term survival and Growth of an business entity, the entity should plan proper and acceptable pricing policy. For example; if a company launches a new product in the market, then the new product should be

Revolutionary Product: This type of product is said to be revolutionary when it is newly introduced in the market and has the potential to create its own value. When a new product is introduced, it has the capability of becoming market leader and capture the major market share.

Evolutionary Product: A Product which has been introduced with some upgradations like with few additional characteristics in it, is known as evolutionary product. It may priced by taking cost benefits, competitor and demand for the product.

Now coming on to main discussion Understanding the role of Predatory pricing done by business entities,

What is Predatory Pricing?

In Predatory pricing, the pricing of goods and services are quoted at such a low level that other firms cannot compete and are forced to leave the market. This type of pricing is mainly done to drive out the competitors from the market & gain the major market share. After driving out the competitors from the market, the dominating firm create its own monopoly and, thereafter controls the entire market and price of products and services. Predatory pricing is also known as undercutting. The main objective

of setting out this type of pricing is to achieve new customers and creating barriers for new entrants.

Predatory pricing is anti-competitive in nature and therefore this type of practice is illegal and is prohibited under many competition laws


Predatory pricers are also termed as loss leaders.

There are two stages in predatory pricing;

1) Predation Stage: In this stage, goods and services are offered at below its cost in order to price its competitors out of the market.

2) Recoupment Stage: This stage only arises in cases where the dominant firm succeeds in squeezing competitors out of the market- within this stage the dominant firm charges monopoly prices in the effort to cover their losses.

At last, this type of practice should be avoided so as to create healthy competition among the players present in the market.

IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT

Sub: Re-schedulement of Foundation Course Examination, May 2022

The Institute vide its Announcement No. 13-CA (Exams)/M/2022 dated 21st January 2022 announced the schedule of Chartered Accountants May 2022 Examinations. Among other examinations, Foundation Examination, May 2022 are to be held on 23rd, 25th, 27th and 29th May 2022. Now the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) – Senior School Certificate Examination, Term II (2021- 2022) and Council for the Indian School Certificate Examinations (ICSE), Semester 2, Year 2022 have announced their schedule of Senior School Certificate Examinations which are to be held during this period.

To mitigate the hardship of the students who are sitting in the aforementioned examinations and simultaneously pursuing Chartered Accountants Foundation Course Examination, May 2022, it has been decided to re-schedule the dates of Foundation Course Examination, May 2022.

The said examination will now be conducted as per the dates given below:

FOUNDATION COURSE EXAMINATION

[As per syllabus contained in the scheme notified by the Council under Regulation 25 F (3) of the Chartered Accountants Regulations, 1988.]

24th, 26th, 28th and 30th June 2022

It may be emphasized that there would be no change in the examination schedule in the event of any day of the examination schedule being declared a Public Holiday by the Central Government or any State Government / Local Holiday.

However, it is clarified that the other particulars / details announced vide Important Announcement No. 13-CA (EXAM)/M/2022 dated 21^{st} January 2022 shall remain unchanged.

Announcement

Registration for Online Home-Based Practical Training Assessment

The next practical training assessment is being conducted online on April 30, May 1, May 2, 2022. The students who have completed their 1st/ 2nd year of practical training during April 1, 2021 – March 31, 2022 are eligible to appear in this test.

The students who have already appeared in the practical training test before (one or two times) and wish to improve their performance/ grade can re-appear in this test by submitting a fee of Rs.200, provided they are eligible for the test as per the eligibility mentioned above. In such case, the best of the grade will be considered for inclusion in the virtual certificate. Similarly, the students who have registered for the earlier test(s) but could not appear due to some reason, can also register for this test with a fee of Rs.200, provided they are eligible for this test. **The registration for the forthcoming test will open on April 4, 2022 (Monday) at 10.00 am and close on April 10, 2022 (Sunday)**.

Students may register for the test during the above mentioned time period through the registration portal https://pttest.icai.org/. Student will be assigned any test date and time out of the aforementioned test dates, depending on the number of candidates. Students will receive their admit card through the portal on April 25, 2022 wherein they will be informed about their test date, time and link for appearing in the test. They will be notified about the Mock Test via an e-mail to their registered e-mail ID or can be checked on the portal also.

Please note that this is the last attempt for students who have completed their second year of practical training during April-June, 2021. However, if a student has completed first year of training during April-June, 2021, this is the last attempt for Level 1 test and the student can appear for Level 2 test on the next occasion.

For any issues/ queries related to registration and appearance, students may contact the Help Desk mentioned on the portal. Students are advised to register for the test well in time to avoid last minute hassles.
